- Abstract Submission Closes 4.00pm Monday 22 July 2024
- Abstract Acceptance Notified Monday 5 August 2024
- Early Bird Deadline for Registrations Monday 26 August 2024

All presenters must register, pay and attend the Conference. Acceptance of abstracts into the program is contingent upon receipt of the registration fee. Notification of abstract acceptance will give presenters the opportunity to take advantage of the early bird registration rate.

ORAL PRESENTATIONS

- If you are selected to offer an oral presentation you will need to present it during the conference sessions. Timings will be confirmed once your abstract is accepted.
- Oral presentations are likely to be 8 minutes in duration plus 2 minutes for Q&A. Times will be strictly enforced by chairpersons.
- Presentations must be provided in PowerPoint format. You may use the PPT template available online when preparing your presentation. The template is the correct format for the AV equipment. Please feel free to amend the content as you see fit.
- Presenters will be asked to send their presentations for testing prior to the start of the conference. Any updates can be loaded and tested in the conference room that you are presenting in.
- Presenters should arrive at their session room at least 30 minutes prior to session commencement in order to introduce themselves to the chairperson and familiarise themselves with the room.
- Standard audio-visual equipment is provided: lectern, microphone, PC laptop, data projector and screen. Please note if you wish to use your own laptop you must ensure that your presentation (including videos) run smoothly prior to your session.

POSTER DISPLAYS

- Posters must be portrait orientation, size A0, (900cm width x1200mm length). Posters that are produced landscape are unable to be accommodated.
- All posters must be mounted by the author during the allocated time period.
- Posters should be typed in clear bold print that can be easily read from distances over one metre with the title displayed in block capitals of minimum size 25mm (1") at the top of the poster.
- Content may be displayed in columns (usually 3 columns).
- Content should contain the study purpose/objectives, methods, results and conclusion(s).
- Illustrations should be professionally drawn (hand drawn material will not be accepted).
- You must be at your poster during the scheduled lunch breaks to present your poster to interested delegates, and answer questions. This will be the time your poster may be judged for any appropriate award/s.
- There may be an opportunity in the programme for you to do a 1-minute presentation of your poster in the main conference plenary sessions. Please prepare for this if you are accepted for poster display. Timings of presentations will be strictly adhered to.

ABSTRACT PREPARATION

Please read the guidelines below carefully. Abstracts not submitted in this format may not be considered for review. If you have any difficulties or queries about the abstract format, please contact the Conference Secretariat by email conferences@w4u.co.nz

Submissions must be original research and not have been presented at any other conference or published elsewhere.

General specifications are:

- Maximum 300 words total, excluding presenters and department
- Limit the number of authors to no more than 7
- All abstracts must be submitted in English

Your abstract should contain the following:

- Title: Sentence case, bold
- Authors/Presenters: Sentence case. Show first name then surname. Put Presenter's name first in the list.
- Department and Institution of all Authors/Presenters: Sentence case.
- Body of Abstracts: Sentence case.

The BODY of your abstract should include these headings in bold:

- *Introduction* (including the study hypothesis)
- Aims, Methods, Results, Conclusions. It is not satisfactory to state that results will be discussed or data will be presented. References (maximum of two). Abbreviations may be used but must be spelt out in full at the first mention followed by the abbreviation in parentheses.

AWARDS

Awards may be presented in the following categories

- Best Oral Presentation
- Best Poster Display

Assessment will be based on content and presentation. The judges will be appointed by the Organising Committee and the decision of the judges will be final. The awards will be presented during the Conference.
